- Note 1 Rent Charge Debtors were about the same as the previous year.
- The Maintenance Fund provision for future repairs to the roads, grounds & services increased Note 2 to £129,732. The fund set up by residents for benches in the Square in memory of Bob Filby was matched by the Residents' Association and two benches were installed in July 2019.

- Note 3 The surface water road drains were cleared in early 2020 (this is only done every 2-3 years).
- Oak Processionary Moth (OPM) caterpillar nests had infested the oak trees in the Square. Note 4 The caterpillars and nests have venomous hairs which can cause skin irritation and asthma. OPM is subject to a control and containment programme co-ordinated by the Forestry Commission but private landowners are responsible for the costs of nest removal and spraying, which may be required for a number of years.
- Note 5 There were no major repairs expenses during 2019-2020 but as a consequence of the OPM related costs there was a overspend against the budget which reduced the planned contribution to the provision for future repairs & maintenance.
